The methodology and time frame applicable to these rates is as follows:

The nursing licensure exam rates are based on first year candidates who took the exam from January 1st through December 31st of each year presented above. These rates are based on the calendar year results as reported by the New York State Board of Nursing.

Our Medical Assisting program does not require licensure for employment. The state licensure requirements indicated here refer to state mandatory licensing requirements for entry level positions only. Once a graduate obtains work experience, additional credentials or licensure may be required to progress forward within a profession. Please keep in mind that licensure exams and certification exams are not necessarily the same thing. Those professions requiring licensure by law mandate a state license in order work in the profession. A license must be obtained prior to seeking employment. In some situations, a state may not require a licensure exam and will award a license if the individual can provide proof he/she has passed a certification examination. Certification represents the achievement of a level of professional competency. In some cases certification is voluntary though it can be required or mandated by employers. Please understand that certain programs require state licensure for employment while other programs strongly encourage students to obtain specialized credentials so graduates can obtain a more qualified entry level position. Please refer to the institutions catalog for the state licensure requirements or credentialing exams for your program of interest.
